The proposed ordinance may be viewed at Cresco City Hall during normal office hours. This hearing will be conducted during a regular Cresco City Council Meeting starting at 7:00 pm.

Any resident of Cresco wishing to be heard concerning the reasons for or objections to the ordinance, must appear at said hearing and voice your opinions.

OWB's – Tonight will be the public hearing and the 2<sup>nd</sup> reading. The minimum height of the chimney will be 18 feet for all OWB's. Except for grandfathered-in OWB's all new OWB's must be at least 200 feet from the nearest neighbor's building.

Tourism Grants – see enclosed applications and recommendations

Urban Renewal Report – this annual report is filed online to report the Urban Renewal Districts (TIF).

Interest Rate – We need to set the interest rate to be charged by Howard County Treasurer on the assessments that are attached to property taxes. After we accept the project, I will send out letters giving homeowners 30 days to pay the assessment with no interest accrued. After the 30 days, then we go and assess them to the property taxes. At this point, interest will accrue from the date we accept the project. All payments will then be collected by the Treasurer and sent to the City with our property tax payments. We are able to charge an interest rate up to 9%. For the last two assessment projects, we have set the rate at 1% higher than the interest rate we are paying on the bond for the project. As you can see, the previous projects had an interest rate of 4.75% which was 1% higher than the bond rate of 3.75%. The bond that we took out for the Granger Road project is at 3.375% so I am suggesting that we charge 4.375% to be consistent with the previous method.

Police Body-Worn Camera Policy – this policy was adopted from the IACP (Iowa Assn of Chiefs of Police) for the new body cameras that we are purchasing. This is a Police policy and is enclosed for the Council to review it. Because it was adopted from a reliable source and seems to address the main issues, we feel that we should not make too many changes to it.

Street Lights – I discussed the proposed street light project with the City's Engineer, Bill Angerman from WHKS, and with the City's Attorney, Joe Braun. Both of their opinions were that since the City employees will be doing the vast majority of the work, and we are restoring the lights to the "originally built condition with essentially the same design". By qualifying as a repair and maintenance for this "horizontal infrastructure" project, we are not subject to the competitive bid nor competitive quote requirements. If it had been subject to the bid process, we would have to hire a licensed engineer to write specs and administer the project which would add additional and unnecessary costs. Bill said they have only been involved in projects where it is all new lights being installed and is usually part of a larger project. We have looked at different brands of fixtures and have decided that Philips was the best choice and then we reviewed different options for looks. Bob's Electric had previously installed all the wiring to the street lights and we feel they should be hired to wire in the new fixtures. He is estimating it to be about \$110/fixture but may be different based on actual time required. Harvey's have quoted us a very fair price of \$60/pole to sandblast and paint the poles.

The Cresco City Council met September 21, 2015, at 7:00 pm at City Hall. Council Members Carman, Bouska, McGee and Loveless were present. McCarville was absent.

Carman made the motion to approve the consent agenda which included approval of the: agenda; claims; minutes of the September 9, 2015 meeting; alley closing for the Library Traveling Museum on 11/2/15 for portions of the alley south of the Library and the Library parking lot; parade permit for the High School Homecoming Parade on 10/9/15 for portions of 3rd Avenue East, North Elm Street and 1st Avenue East. McGee seconded and it passed all ayes.

Public Works Director Rod Freidhof reported (a) watermain project is continuing; (b) flushing hydrants September 30<sup>th</sup> - October 2<sup>nd</sup>; (c) Sewer plant will be replacing membranes on the aeration basins starting October 7<sup>th</sup> and should take about 2 weeks to complete draining, cleaning and replacing membranes on both tanks; (d) street department will be doing concrete work on the bike trail and other areas in town the next few weeks; (e) Skyline, WHKS and Freidhof will do the final walk through on the Granger Road project tomorrow. There are still a few issues that Skyline will need to address; (i) no price available on the proposed street lights yet. Chad Harvey did sandblast and paint a light pole and it turned out really good. He is reducing his quote from \$85 to \$60 per pole.

The Police Chief Tim Ruroden reported the weekend was relatively uneventful with a few arrests. Officers are busy with a few investigations. Next week will have firearm training for all of the officers.

City Clerk Girolamo reported (a) busy doing year end reports (b) working with Advantage Administrators on health insurance options for the December 1<sup>st</sup> renewal; (c) Barb Holstrom requested permission to fly Cadet flags downtown starting Sunday October 4 through Saturday October 10<sup>th</sup> to reflect the full week of Homecoming events. Council unanimously approved the request; (d) financial statements were enclosed in the packet reflecting a healthy cash balance and two months into the year everything looks good.

Amy Bouska reported she attended the Library Board meeting. She presented the Energy Audit findings and showed them the very short payback period if they replaced the basement lights with LED's and suggested they contact companies for options. The Energy Committee is now analyzing the upstairs lights as well. She also sent the energy audit results to the Theatre Commission for them to review.

John Loveless reported that the Marketing Committee created an advertisement for the 150<sup>th</sup> Celebration to be played before the movies at the Theatre. It can also be viewed on You Tube.

Helen Kapler and Darlene Byrnes reported that they had been to a Howard County Supervisors meeting. They had a petition to stop the proposed shooting range on Valley Avenue. They feel it is too dangerous because it is too close to houses and the cemetery. The Supervisors instructed them to come to the City because the County Attorney said the City had jurisdiction within two miles of the City limits. The Mayor explained that the City's jurisdiction outside the city limits is limited to jurisdiction over subdivisions only. The Mayor read portions of Chapter 170 of the Cresco Code of Ordinances that explained the jurisdiction is limited to subdivisions and the definitions of when the jurisdiction is applicable. The proposed shooting range does not fall under the definition of a subdivision and therefore since it is outside the City limits, the City of Cresco has no jurisdiction.

Bouska made the motion set the public hearing for October 5, 2015 to amend the City of Cresco Code of Ordinances by adding new Chapter 148 pertaining to Outdoor Woodburner/Boilers (OWB's). Loveless seconded and it passed all ayes.

Mayor Bohle performed the first reading of the proposed Ordinance 457 which amends the City of Cresco Code of Ordinances by adding new Chapter 148 pertaining to

OWB's. McGee made the motion to approve the first reading. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes.

Loveless made the motion to approve the resolution to approve and adopt the annual City Street Financial Report from July 1, 2014 to June 30, 2015. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes.

Bouska made the motion to approve the Outstanding Obligation Report for June 30, 2015. McGee seconded and it passed all ayes.

Since we have not received any prices on the proposed street light options, discussion was tabled until the next meeting

Mayor asked if there were any comments from the audience. Jody Torgerson showed Council two pictures taken by American Imagery of some of the buildings in Cresco. One of the pictures highlighted the American Flag painted on the roof of Jody's building.

Carman moved to adjourn at 7:16 pm. Bouska seconded and it passed all ayes. The next regular Cresco City Council meeting will be October 5, 2015 at 7:00 pm at Cresco City Hall.

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


