THIS NOTICE IS GIVEN AT THE DIRECTION OF THE MAYOR PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 21, CODE OF IOWA AND THE LOCAL RULES OF SAID GOVERNMENTAL BODY. POSTED SEPTEMBER 30, 2022.

Mayor Pro-Tem Bouska called the Cresco City Council meeting to order on September 19, 2022, at 5:30 pm. Council Members Kriener, McConnell, Fortune, Bouska, and Carman were present. Mayor Brenno attended via Zoom. No council members were absent.

Carman made the motion to approve the consent agenda which included approval of the: agenda; claims; minutes from the September 6, 2022 special meeting, September 7, 2022 special meeting, and September 7, 2022 regular Council meeting; Parade Permit for portions of 3rd Avenue and North Elm Street for the Santa's Holiday Parade on November 25, 2022. Kriener seconded and it passed all ayes.

Public Works Director Widell reported: (a) EV Charging stations should be up and running this week; (b) waiting on sludge testing; (c) Visu-Sewer will be doing manhole rehab so be cautious in alleys; (d) flushing hydrants on October 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup>.

Police Chief Ruroden thanked everyone that came out and supported the Police Department's fundraiser on September 17, 2022. He is working on getting the new car ordered and equipment installed in the new vehicles. Officers are doing well at the academy.

City Clerk Elton reported: (a) received notice of union negotiations for wages only, Council will need to meet to discuss; (b) CIP project sheets are due tomorrow; (c) will start working on budget after CIP projects are identified; (d) will work with Piper Sandler regarding bonding for projects.

Fortune reported the Theatre Commission met and went over CIP and discussed rental rates. CRICCET discussed terms for members and the pickleball project.

McConnell reported the airport met and went over the CIP. Park board met and discussed the pickleball project, offering more classes, increasing rentals at the lodge, and arts and crafts during the winter.

Mayor Pro-Tem Bouska welcomed the Boy Scout troop and asked for comments from the audience. Stan Krider addressed the council with questions on recycling.

Mayor Pro-Tem Bouska opened the Public Hearing for Budget Amendment #1 for fiscal year ending June 30, 2023. There were no written or oral comments and the public hearing was closed. Carman made the motion to approve the resolution amending the current budget for Fiscal Year ending June 2023. Fortune seconded and it passed all ayes.

Kelly O'Donnell presented the insurance renewal package. EMC will conduct inspections of the buildings to establish estimated replacement costs for the Council to determine if valuations should be increased or decreased. Premiums have increased so he will give some options with increasing deductibles and the impact on premiums for the Council to consider.

Carman made the motion to approve the resolution authorizing the Mayor to enter into a Facilities Use Agreement with Northeast Iowa Area Agency on Aging. McConnell seconded and it passed all ayes.

Discussion was held regarding solid waste collection for dumpsters and recycling. Several business owners discussed concerns with the recycling center being closed to the public. The Mayor, Council, and City Hall also received numerous complaints. Julian, Lucas, and Ross Merritt represented Hawkeye Sanitation and Hawkeye Recycling. They explained it had to be closed due to potential loss of future revenue from dumpster collection fees and due to past losses. Hawkeye will write up a proposal for the Council to consider with options to open the recycling center as soon as possible.

Applications for the billing clerk position are due September 26<sup>th</sup>. Gary, Rich, Nate, Niki, and Michelle will conduct interviews early next week and hopefully have a recommendation for hiring at the next meeting.

Carman moved to adjourn at 7:10 pm. McConnell seconded and it passed all ayes. The next regular Cresco City Council meeting will be October 3, 2022, at 5:30 pm at Cresco City Hall.

**Q:** Describe the project. Provide details of the project and the budget, other fundraising efforts, and the who, what, where, why and how of the project.

**A:** The Cresco Wildlife Club building is in need of a new floor. The existing floor is uneven, cracked and not safe for members and visitors. Many of our members are elderly and have a difficult time walking on this floor. We are concerned for visitors, wheelchairs, walkers and elderly who visit during the MIGHTY Howard County Fair and during one of our many events and dinners we promote throughout the year. RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING ELECTRIC VEHICLE CHARGING STATION FEES

WHEREAS, the City of Cresco seeks to encourage increased use of electric vehicles in the City of Cresco; and

WHEREAS, the City of Cresco, Iowa, has installed electric vehicle charging stations for public use; and

WHEREAS, the City Council now desires to establish regulations and fees for electric vehicle charging stations owned by the City of Cresco, Iowa.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the City Council of the City of Cresco, Iowa, as follows:

1. That the active charging rate for electric vehicle charging stations be \$.3135/kWh.
2. That the inactive rate for electric vehicle charging stations be \$2.00/hour, beginning 30 minutes after charging is complete.
3. That no person shall park a vehicle in a city designated parking space for an electric vehicle charging station without actively charging their vehicle (by conductive or inductive means). Enforcement procedures for parking violations shall be imposed pursuant to City of Cresco Code of Ordinances Chapter 70.

Applicant shall indemnify, defend and hold harmless the City and all of its elected officials, members, employees, officers and agents from and against all claims, liabilities, judgments, damages, losses and costs, including attorney fees, and all expenses which result from the investigation and defense thereof, which arise from or are related to death, damages (including loss of use) or injuries to third persons or their property and their members, employees, officers and agents, which are occasioned in whole or part by any act or omission of the Applicant in its providing solid waste and/ or recycling collections and hauling services and in the conduct of any and all operations permitted or required by any permit or agreement with the City for solid waste and/ or recycling collections and hauling services. The parties will give each other prompt and reasonable notice of any claim made or actions instituted which in any way directly or indirectly affects or may affect each other or Applicant's insured, and each party shall have the right to investigate, compromise, and defend the same to the extent of its own interests. The City shall have the right, but not the duty, to participate in the defense of any claim or litigation with attorneys of the City's selection without relieving Applicant of any obligations hereunder. Any final judgment rendered against the City for any cause for which Applicant is liable hereunder shall be conclusive against Applicant as to liability and amount. Applicant's obligations herein shall survive any termination of any permit issued by the City or any agreement with the City for solid waste and/ or recycling collections and hauling services.

The City shall have no liability to the Applicant or any sub-contractor or agent of Applicant for damage to Applicant's or sub-contractor's or agent's property of whatever nature caused by fire, windstorm, explosion, or for any other reason, including theft. Applicant further agrees to accept full responsibility for the acts and omissions of its own sub-contractors and agents.

**Certification and release authorization**

If the applicant is not an individual, the person signing this application acknowledges that he or she has the authority to act on behalf of the group that is requesting the permit. The Addendum must state all owners.
